Imagine seeing a hundred bonfires floating above the Peconic River...stroll a boardwalk surrounded by mood setting music that enters your being and puts you at ease... the fires crackle as young and old enjoy music, dance, food and community through a series of free events.

20 years ago, Barnaby Evans artist and founder created the first WaterFire in Providence. To date installations include Ohio, Missouri, Pennsylvania, Houston, Singapore and Rome.

It requires philanthropy and volunteers, it generates jobs and it 'takes back the night'. It changes the community and there is no comparable experience.

In the fall of 2014, Riverhead and Southampton towns passed resolutions to support a WaterFire installation on the Peconic. East End Arts is leading the community in supporting this initiative.
